ORDER OF BATTLE SUMMARY - UNITED ARAB REPUBLIC (EGYPT) (U)

1. (S/NFD) Introduction

- dominant element of the Armed Forces and has primarily a defensive mission. Basic tactical doctrine is developing along Soviet Army principles with the aid of Soviet and Eastern European advisors and instructors in the UAR and through the training of some Egyptian personnel in the Warsaw Pact countries. Diverse British and German influences remaining from earlier foreign schooling and training missions are largely being replaced. Arms and equipment are predominantly of Soviet origin and World War II design. Organized reserve forces mainly comprise infantry and artillery units equipped with older Western weapons and generally in a low state of training. Paramilitary forces include:
- (1) The Frontier Corps: a light reconnaissance-type desert police force of 6,000 men responsible for the operation of frontier posts and patrolling of desert areas. It is subordinate to the Frontier Administration in the Ministry of War.
- (2) The Security and Guard Forces: 25 lightly armed and low-quality battalions, with a total strength of 5,000, manned mostly by personnel too old for military service. Their mission is to guard important industrial facilities, public utilities, and communications centers.
- (3) The National Guard: reportedly loosely organized into a division of eight brigades, but for operational purposes consisting of small guard platoons and companies formed in many of the larger towns and cities. Most or all of these units are of the commando or <u>fedayeen</u> type, lightly armed and trained in guerrilla and sabotage activities. Its estimated active duty strength is only 3,000. However, 45,000 former members could carry out guerrilla and sabotage activities.
- (4) The Coast Guard: a force whose mission is to prevent smuggling and illegal immigration and to exercise complete police functions in coastal regions and inaccessible areas. It is equipped with small arms and has a strength of approximately 7,300 men.
- b. (C) <u>Command Structure</u>. The Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces is the President. The top military commander is the Deputy Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces. There are governmental provisions for a National Defense Council to formulate defense policy, but, in fact, all major decisions concerning the Armed Forces are taken by one or both of the above individuals. The Minister of War, brought back into the armed forces chain of command by Republican Decree (11 Oct 66), now has the powers and assignments formerly held by the Office of the Deputy Supreme Commander and is over all general and flag officers. The operational staff for the Armed Forces at GHQ, Al 'Abbasiyah, Cairo, also serves as HQ for the army. Multiple command channels extend from GHQ to tactical units directly, through territorial HQ, and through chiefs of the combat arms.

c. (e) Territorial Organization. The settled portions of the Nile Valley and Delta, the Canal Zone, and the Sinai peninsula are divided into four area commands. Eastern Area Command, with headquarters at Ismailia, is responsible for the defense of the Suez Canal, the Eastern Delta, and East Sinai. Directly subordinate to this command are the Canal and Eastern Delta District and the East Sinai District. Northern Area Command has its headquarters at Alexandria and is responsible for the Nile Delta in the vicinity of the city to a depth of about 50 miles from the coast. Central Area Command, with headquarters at Cairo, is responsible for the remainder of the Delta and the Nile Valley to approximately 75 miles south of the capital. The area of responsibility of the Southern Area Command, headquarters at Manqabad, extends south to include the rest of the populated corridor of the Nile Valley. Each command supervises local administrative matters of supply, subsistence, health, passive air defense, and internal security affairs of forces in its area.

The outlying desert regions of the country are not included in the four commands but are divided into four governorates administered by the Frontier Corps, which maintains small garrisons at frontier posts and light reconnaissance outrol units. These governorates and their HQ are: Western Desert Governorates, Matruh; Southern Desert Governorate, Al Kharijah; Red Sea Governorate, Al Ghurdaqah; and Sinai Governorate, Al 'Arish.

d. (S/NFD) Types of Tactical Units. The largest tactical organization is the division, of which there are: 4 infantry (strength estimated at 12,000), 2 armored (estimated strength 9,000), and 2 AAA. There are 28 independent brigades: 18 infantry, 2 coast artillery, 2 field artillery, 3 commando, 1 parachute, and 2 Palestinian. The brigade is comparable to a U.S. regiment. Organization is on the Soviet pattern.

NOTE: The reserve forces include an additional 8 infantry brigades maintained at cadre strength.

e. (3/NFD) Methods of Unit Identification. No obvious pattern is discernible in the numbering of units. Infantry battalions are numbered in the "l - 39", "50", "70", "300" and "500" series; regular infantry brigades are numbered in the "l - 18" series. Field artillery battalions are numbered in the "300 - 330" and "394 - 406" series; field artillery brigades bear odd numbers in the "40" and "50" series. Tank and armored infantry battalions are numbered in the "200" series; tank brigades in the "l - 15" series. AAA battalions appear to be numbered in the "340 - 380" and "400" series; AAA regiments apparently will be numbered in the "60 - 90" series, and the newly formed AAA brigades in the "90" series.

NOTE: The AAA organization appears to contain a unit termed "fawj" which probably is both larger and more self-sufficient than a regular battalion and therefore is referred to as a regiment; an AAA "fawj" may also imply that the unit contains both conventional AAA and SA-2 weapons. The infantry division troops also contain a unit termed "fawj", meaning a contingent of undetermined size, comprising both armor and infantry, also referred to as a regiment.



4. (S/NFD) Summary of Significant Developments.

- a. The expansion of the Egyptian Armed Forces, announced by President Nasir on 23 December 1901, is continuing. Additional reserve infantry brigades are being organized and a second AAA division is forming. It is likely that the army strength has increased to 175,000. The AAA organization is equipped with both conventional antiaircraft artillery guns and Soviet SA-2 surface-to-air missiles for defense of the Cairo and Alexandria areas, the Suez Canal, and the Aswan Dam.
- b. The Egyptian Army has been heavily committed to operations in Yemen since the overthrow of the Imam on 26 September 1962. Although a ceasefire has been signed and the UAR has announced plans to withdraw from Yemen, an estimated 40,000 troops are still there.
