Last week in Saigon [redacted]

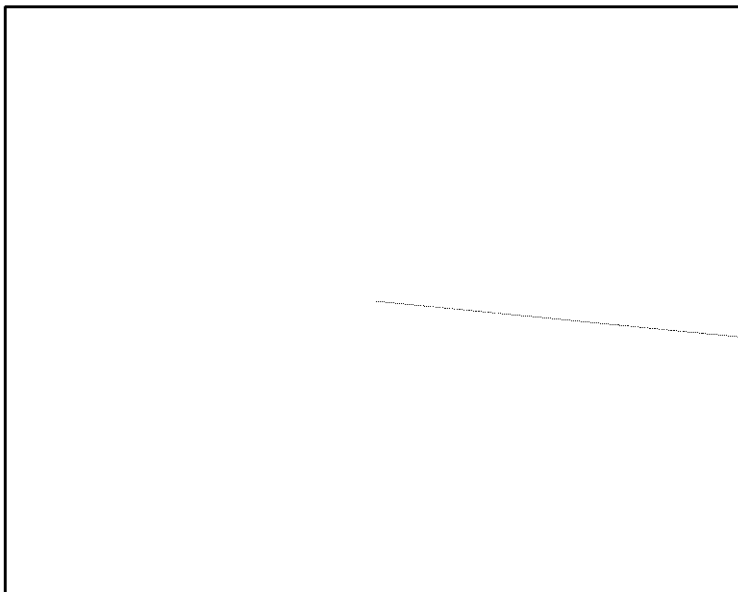
[redacted] and I briefed General Westmoreland and his staff on anti-United States-policy-in-Vietnam organizations, individuals and groups. The briefing relied extensively on Federal Bureau of Investigation material.

I acknowledged to General Westmoreland that the FBI supplied the substantive information for the presentation. Also I took the liberty of stating that the FBI would do everything possible in its power at this critical time to lighten the load on the Commander United States Military Assistance Command Vietnam. This visibly touched General Westmoreland. He expressed deep appreciation and recalled an earlier period of personal correspondence with you.

The General specifically expressed concern over the seditious mailings (Vietnam Day Committee) and broadcasts (Radio Stateside) to United States soldiers.

En route to Tan Son Nhut Airport General Westmoreland had the enclosed delivered to me.
