During his military career he has become acquainted with a great number of U.S. Army officers who have served in Iran as advisors to the Imperial Iranian Ground Forces. He probably also has American friends among his class mates at the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College.

he prefers soft drinks or fruit juice. He prefers tea to coffee, but will drink coffee if tea is not available.

His preference in meat is lamb, but he will eat veal, beef, fowl or fish. He is fond of green salads and fresh fruit (including cucumbers, which Iranians consider to be a fruit rather than a vegetable which he eats with a knife and fork. ITEM 7 a.: Continued: The terms Iranian Army should be avoided. In Iranian Military terminology "Army" is used to refer collectively to all three Iranian services, Ground Forces, Air Forces, and Naval Forces.

ITEM 10: Continued: General OVEISI occupies the official residence maintained for the Commander of the Imperial Iranian Ground Forces. This is located in the Shemiran area of northern Tehran on Pahlavi Avenue.

ITEM 16: Continued: and ceremonial is shared by many Iranian general officers. The honor is conferred by the Shahanshah himself and is denoted by an elaborate yellow or gold aigulette worn on the right shoulder.

ITEM 41: Continued: which he eats with his breakfast. His breakfast normally consists of cheese, eggs, tea, toast, and honey, jelly or jam along with fruit juice. He is reported to be an avid hunter and an excellent marksman, but the requirements of his office allow him little time for these pursuits.

ITEM 43: Continued: General OVEISI's first wife (Sherafat OVEISI) died of cancer in 1971. He subsequently (1973) married his present wife. The first three children listed in item 50 are by his first wife.

53. ACQUAINTANCES AND RELATIVES - Apparent influence of acquaintances and relatives on subject's views or career.
General OVEISI is a member of a large and prominent Iranian family. He has several brothers who hold middle level governmental positions. Collectively, they probably exert a moderate influence on his political views. General OVEISI is a long time friend of General MINBASHIAN, his predecessor as CG of the IIGF. Presumably this friendship continues even though MINBASHIAN has been retired and it is probable that MINBASHIAN (See Continuation Sheet)

54. CHARACTER - Subject's character, strengths and weaknesses, intelligence, loyalty, judgment, ability to communicate, leadership ability, and influence. Significance of individual in shaping international policies of his country.
General OVEISI is intelligent and possesses a quick sharp mind. He is well read and well informed on military matters, particularly as they pertain to the IIGF. Though he is of a generally quiet disposition and calm temperament, (b)(6) He is self-disciplined and maintains very high standards for himself and his subordinates. He is a tireless worker and has been described as a man who knows how, and likes, to use power. He is a strict disciplinarian and is unforgiving with those who cross him or fail to adhere to the standards of conduct or performance which he demands. (b)(6) politeness and charm which is characteristic of him.

55. POLITICAL ORIENTATION - Attitude towards United States and other countries. Remarks and actions of subject toward representatives of the United States and its allies, and to representatives of nonaligned nations and Communist bloc nationals. Political activities and attitudes, important political contacts, party affiliations, potential political influence in country in the event of a change in government.
He appears to be completely loyal to the SHAH and to the government of Iran. He is anti-communist and suspicious of Soviet designs in the Middle East. His attitude is, in part, a reflection of the attitude of the SHAHANSHAH and, in part, based on his own observations of the conduct of the USSR in Iran during and following the Second World War. His relationship with American military advisors has always been good. This and his training at Fort Leavenworth dispose him favorably toward the U.S. He is not so favorably disposed toward the UK. He is somewhat distrustful of their motives.

General OVEISI is in good physical condition and presents a neat well groomed appearance both in uniform and civilian clothing. He favors conservative clothing, is clean shaven and wears his hair short in a traditional military manner. He is of short stature but carries himself very erect.

General OVEISI enjoys a reputation as a hard working field soldier rather than as a "salon soldier." In his relationships with American military advisors he has been quick to accept and act on advice given. He understands modern command techniques and probably delegates authority better than most Iranian officers. He is training oriented and demands a considerable amount of field training. He is sometimes arbitrary and a strict disciplinarian.

He is generally regarded as having reached his position on the basis of his professional competence rather than on the basis of political favor or family connections. The fact that he has been able to hold his position through two scandals (in which he was not directly involved) which might have indicated the dismissal of lesser men is probably a direct indication of the esteem in which he is held by the SHAHANSHAH.

ITEM 53: Continued: exerts an influence on OVEISI's thinking and attitude on military and political matters. General OVEISI is a classmate of the SHAHANSHAH's when the latter attended the Military Academy at Tehran. While this relationship may tend to further strengthen OVEISI's loyalty to the SHAH, OVEISI probably owes his high position to his professional competence rather than to his relationship with the monarch. Approximately six months after the disgrace of his father-in-law (Refer to Item 57 of Form) General OVEISI's close friend and subordinate, LTG KIUMARS-SALEH, the Chief of the Logistics Command of the IIGF was arrested on charges of misappropriation of IIGF funds. He was reduced two ranks, dismissed from the service, fined and sentenced to prison. While there has never been a hint of suspicion that General OVEISI was himself knowledgeable or involved in any way, his association and friendship with these officers has probably served to limit his career.
