HAVANA'S LONG-TERM GOALS VIS-A-VIS LIMA MAY INCLUDE TRY ING TO INSTALL A LEFT IST REGIME IN PERU, BUT FOR NOW CASTRO WILL MOVE CAREFULLY SINCE HE IS AWARE THAT THE US IS WAT CHING HIS ACT IONS IN LATIN AMERICA. MOREOVER, HAVANA APPARENTLY DOES NOT WANT TO BE INVOLVED (80 PERCENT, B) IN THE DORMANT DISPUTE BETWEEN PERS AND CHILE, EVEN THOUGH SOME CHILEAN OFFICERS FEAR THIS OCCURRENCE.
