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BA-17 4-12-76 believed that the officers present reported honestly, for to attempt to lie in the face of a direct order of the Army Commander would be both personally and professionally very dangerous. The conclusion of the members of his organization was that the abduction of Cabezas was either an operation undertaken independently by low level elements of a security force, or was a case of General Suarez Mason's personal hit squad performing an abduction of a high-profile human rights leader to embarrass Videla and Viola. He reported that the intelligence services were resigned to waiting until Cabezas' body appeared, considering this to be a case almost identical to the abduction of Elena Holmberg in November 1978.

- 4. Our assessment of this report is that it is probably true in its essential elements. It is possible that one or more participants withheld information or suspicions about the abduction. Pointing the finger at General Suarez Mason is common, and while the allegation of his involvement is possibly true, it strikes us as too conveniently self-serving.
- 5. On May 9 Charge pressed General Viola's aide for information on disappearances and was informed that the General had not yet received all the replies to his inquiries on the matter but that a response would be forthcoming shortly. FonOff also said no GOA response ready yet, but would push for reply. Embassy will keep the issue of these disappearances before the GOA.

MONTHS TO ESTABLISH THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE DISAPPEARED PERSON; IF NO INFORMATION IS DEVELOPED, THE GOVERNMENT WOULD AUTHORIZE PRESUMPTIVE DEATH, OPENING THE WAY FOR FAMILIES TO CLAIM SURVIVORS' BENEFITS AND REGULARIZE THEIR LEGAL STATUS. FINALLY, THE FAMILY COULD CLAIM INDEMNIZATION FROM THE GOVERNMENT. PASTOR APPARENTLY DID NOT DETAIL HOW THE INDEMNIZATION WOULD WORK. PASTOR ALSO TOLD THE AMBASSADORS THAT THE GOA IS REDOUBLING ITS EFFORTS TO REDUCE THE PEN POPULATION. HE SAID THAT THE PEN POPULATION SHOULD BE REDUCED FROM THE PRESENT 2000 OR SO TO ABOUT 500 WITHIN TWO OR THREE MONTHS AND TO 50 OF THE "HARD-CORE UNRELEASABLES" BY THE END OF THE YEAR. PASTOR SAID THE INTERIOR MINISTRY HAS INCREASED ITS PEN LEGAL REVIEW STAFF FROM FOUR TO 30 LAWYERS. HE SAID RELEASES UNDER OPTION WOULD INCREASE, AND THAT OTHER PEN PRISONERS WOULD BE TURNED OVER TO THE JUSTICE SYSTEM FOR TRIAL OR RELEASED OUTRIGHT OR GRANTED CONDITIONAL LIBERTY. ACCORDING TO OUR FRENCH EMBASSY SOURCE, PASTOR IMPLIED THAT THE ABOVE-MENTIONED IMPROVE-MENTS WERE BEING IMPLEMENTED IN TIME FOR THE INTER-AMERICAN HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION VISIT WHICH HE SEEMED TO EXPECT WOULD OCCUR SOMETIME IN THE FALL, IN SEPTEMBER OR OCTOBER.
