1. (U) On 10 July 1976, government security forces neutralized two important guerrilla installations. One contained a printing plant which also served as the prison for former Comodoro Roberto Echegoyen. Security forces discovered the body of the Comodoro there and later found a large printing plant operated by the guerrillas. On the same day in another Buenos Aires suburb, neighbors provided government forces with information that led to the discovery of a large terrorist library. The library reportedly contained a significant quantity of bibliographies and files on guerrilla leadership. Interrogation of a prisoner captured in the 10 July printing plant raid produced information that led to the discovery in Cordoba of another fully equipped clandestine

printing plant. The second shop which was 32 feet below ground, 45 feet long and 16 feet wide, was equipped with offset printers, rotaprinters and extensive photographic equipment. It was used to print books, leaflets and training manuals and reportedly the largest of its type to be discovered.

2. ~~(C//NFINTTEL//NOFORN)~~ COMMENT: The discovery last week of the two printing plants and library will undoubtedly have a tremendous impact on the propaganda arm of the guerrillas. It is unknown, however, to what extent or how these facilities were used in the planning and preparation of terrorist activities. If they serve a role in the intelligence apparatus of the guerrillas as some reports have suggested, the capability of the terrorists may have been effected. It remains to be seen just what impact these government victories will have.
