- 2. (U) GENERAL BALZA RELATED THAT THE ARGARM CURRENTLY HAS 1300 PERSONNEL DEPLOYED IN PEACE KEEPING MISSIONS OVERSEAS, INCLUDING 900 IN CROATIA, 270 IN CYPRUS, 55 IN KUWAIT, AND UNSPECIFIED NUMBERS IN OTHER LOCATIONS IN THE MIDDLE EAST, MOZAMBIQUE, ANGOLA, AND WESTERN SAHARA. HE ADDED THAT THE ARGENTINE NAVY HAS 103 PERSONNEL AND THE AIR FORCE HAS TWO IN CYPRUS, AS WELL. WHILE HE DOES NOT FEEL THAT THIS EMPLOYMENT OF THE ARGARM WAS EVER IMAGINED A FEW YEARS AGO, THE RESTRUCTURING OF THE ARGENTINE ARMED FORCES IN RECENT YEARS HAS COMPLEMENTED AND FACILITATED ITS REORIENTATION AS A MAJOR PLAYER IN INTERNATIONAL PEACE KEEPING.
- 3. (U) WITH REGARD TO THE CONCERNS RAISED BY THE CHIEFS OF STAFF OF THE ARGENTINE ARMED FORCES SEVERAL WEEKS AGO ABOUT THE WELFARE OF MILITARY PERSONNEL AND THEIR FAMILIES IN THE WAKE OF SEVERE BUDGETARY AUSTERITY, GENERAL BALZA EXPRESSED OPTIMISM THAT THE COMMISSION WORKING THE BUDGETARY ISSUE IN THE JOINT STAFF WOULD ARRIVE AT A VIABLE SOLUTION ACCEPTABLE TO BOTH THE MILITARY AND GOVERNMENT (NFI). HE ADDED THAT THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A VOLUNTEER MILITARY NEXT YEAR IS ADEQUATELY FUNDED AND THAT IT IS A POSITIVE STEP OF WHICH HE HAS BEEN AN ADVOCATE SINCE RETURNING FROM THE FALKLANDS/MALVINAS WAR IN 1982.
- 4. (U) **GENERAL BALZA** DISMISSES THE SUGGESTION THAT HE BE NICKNAMED THE "DEMOCRACY GENERAL," STATING THAT (NOT WITHSTANDING SOME LAMENTABLE ERRORS OF THE PAST) THE ARGARM HAS ALWAYS BEEN INVESTED WITH THE PRINCIPLES OF DEMOCRACY. CONCERNING THOSE UNSPECIFIED ERRORS, **BALZA**

INDICATED THAT ONE CANNOT CHANGE THE PAST; HOWEVER, THE LESSONS OF THE PAST SHOULD BE STUDIED OBJECTIVELY WITH HUMILITY AND SELF-CRITICISM. THE GENERAL CITED THE RESTRUCTURING OF THE ARMY AS A POSITIVE RESULT OF SUCH DELIBERATION.

5. (U) WHEN ASKED IF ARGENTINE MILITARY INTELLIGENCE, LIMITED AS IT IS TO OPERATIONS AGAINST FOREIGN THREATS, IS CAPABLE OF DEALING WITH INTERNATIONAL TERRORISM, BALZA REPLIED THAT MILITARY INTELLIGENCE IS PREPARED TO CARRY OUT ITS MISSION WITHIN THE LIMITS IMPOSED ON IT BY THE LAW. HE ADDED THAT THIS REQUIRES DISCRETION, AND HE COMMENTED THAT ONLY IN ARGENTINA IS SO MUCH MENTION MADE OF SENS ITIVE INTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS IN THE PUBLIC MEDIA.

6. (U) GENERAL BALZA DECLINED COMMENT ON THE RECENT CONTROVERSY IN THE ARGENTINE NAVY REGARDING THE ADMISSION BY MIDDLE-LEVEL OFFICERS OF PARTICIPATION IN ACTS OF HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSE DURING THE SO CALLED "DIRTY WAR" (CITE: IIR 6 804 0012 95). HE INDICATED THAT IT WOULD BE INAPPROPRIATE FOR HIM TO COMMENT ON SUCH MATTERS INTERNAL TO A SISTER SERVICE. WHEN ASKED HOW HE WOULD HANDLE A SIMILAR SITUATION IF IT WERE TO OCCUR IN THE ARMY, BALZA REMARKED THAT HE WOULD "CROSS THAT BRIDGE WHEN HE CAME TO IT." SIMILARLY, WHEN ASKED HIS OPINION OF A REQUEST BY MODIN POLITICIAN ARTURO ((FRONDIZI)) FOR AMNESTY FOR JAILED "CARAPINTADA" COLONEL MOHAMED ALI ((SEINELDIN)) AND HIS FOLLOWERS, GENERAL BALZA INDICATED THE MATTER IS A POLITICAL ONE IN WHICH THE MILITARY HAS NO ROLE.
