

EXISTING 167-KILOMETER LINE BETWEEN WEST NICHO LSON AND HEANY JUNCTIONS AND UPGRADING THE 20-KILOMETER SECTION FROM COLLEEN BAWN TO WEST NICHOLSON AS WELL AS REBUILDING SECTIONS OF THE 56-KILOMETER RAIL BETWEEN MBALABALA AND HEANY JUNCTION.

2. (C): THE RAILWAY PROJECT WILL LINK THE SOUTHERN AFRICAN DEVELOPMENT COMMUNITIES (SADC) BUSIEST BORDER TOWN IN SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA (BEITBRIDGE) TO ZIMBABWE'S RAILWAY NERVE-CENTER CITY OF (BULAWAYO).

3. (C) THE VENTURE IS BEING UNDERTAKEN BY THE LIMPOPOP PROJECTS (PVT) LTD AND THE NATIONAL RAILWAYS OF ZIMBABWE UNDER THE BUILD-OPERATE-TRANSFER AGREEMENT. THUS THE PROJECT WOULD BE HANDED OVER TO THE GOVERNMENT AFTER 30 YEARS.

EIGHT MONTHS BEHIND SCHEDULE. IN 9710 CONSTRUCTION HAD BEEN APPROVED, HOWEVER DUE TO LACK OF FUNDING CONSTRUCTION WAS PUT OFF UNTIL 9806. THE RAILLINK SHOULD INCREASE EXPORT AND IMPORT OPPORTUNITIES FOR ZIMBABWE. SADC PEACEKEEPING LOGISTICS EFFORTS WILL ALSO BE INCREASED. MOST COUNTRIES UNDER SADC DO NOT HAVE AIR L IFT SUPPORT FOR HEAVY EQUIPMENT, AND OFTEN ROAD MARCHES OF GREAT DISTANCES WITH THE DATED EQUIPMENT, COMBINED WITH POOR ROAD CONDITIONS, PLAY HAVOC IN DEPLOYING TROOPS AND EQUIPMENT GREAT DISTANCES. THE RAIL CONNECTION SHOULD SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASE THE TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES BETWEEN SADC MILITARIES.

2. (U) THE RAIL PROJECT IS COMING AT A TIME WHEN MOZAMBUQUE, BOTSWANA, NAMIMBIA AND SOUTH AFRICA ARE ALL INCREASING THEIR TRANCONTINENTAL HIGHWAY CAPABILITIES. SOUTH AFRICAN PRESIDENT NELSON ((MANDELA)) AND MOZAMBIQUE PRESIDENT ((CHISSANO)) IN 9806 ON THE BORDER OF THE TWO COUNTRIES UNVEILED A PLAQUE COMMEMORATING THE START OF CONSTRUCTION OF THE 440-KILOMETER M APUTO

CORRIDOR TOLL ROAD WHICH WILL CONNECT THE MOZAMBIQUE PORT TOWN OF MAPUTO TO WITBANK IN SOUTH AFRICA. THE CORRIDOR IS SCHEDULED TO BE COMPLTED IN 2001. THE CORRIDOR, BESIDES LINKING MAPUTO WITH WITBANK, OFFERS GOOD ROAD CONNECTIONS TO JOHANNESBURG AND ON THROUGH BOTSWANA TO WINDHOEK AND WALVIS BAY ON NAMIBIA'S ATLANTIC CO AST - A TRANSCONTINENTAL HIGHWAY OF MORE THAN 2.500 KMS.

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
