

H. (U) Indian Minister of External Affairs (MEA) Sinha publicly raised the compliance bar stating on 27 July that peaceful Kashmiri elections will now be on Musharraf's "litmus test." Previously the bar included: extradition of the "List of 20" of the Indian most wanted militants/terrorists/fugitives, stopping a variety of infiltration-related support activity, and dismantling the camps before bilateral talks and further de-escalation could begin.

(b)(3):10 USC 424	There were nine attacks against security forces, out of which 2 of 5 grenade attacks involved grenades tossed in the general direction of security forces, but which missed the target resulting in a total of 22 civilian casualties. Similar attacks also resulted in 31 civilian casualties in the three days between the end of last week's DAR reporting period (19-23 July) and the beginning of this week's reporting (26 July – 1 August). Such attacks indicate poorly executed attempts by militants to hit security forces. It also highlights their lack of regard for civilian casualties.

week's DAR), the same number of NC members, also a *Halqa* president and two activists were killed. Militants also killed a civilian who is listed as a candidate for the impending elections. These attacks are designed to disrupt the October elections in Kashmir, intimidate voters, and thus create conditions not conducive to the conduct of free and fair elections. New Delhi needs legitimate elections to lend support to its Kashmir policy and its sovereignty claims.

4. (S) The first attack against Amarnath Yatra pilgrims occurred this week. A grenade was thrown at a taxi, killing the driver and a passenger and injuring three other occupants. The taxi was most likely a target of opportunity for a quick hit and run attack, but still signifies the militants' desire to disrupt the pilgrimage and terrorize the populace. A housing complex for political and police officials was attacked around 1 August.
