Explanation of Format

- a. Reference PART B OVERALL SIGNIFICANT TRENDS

 Trends and charts shown in PART B are self-explanatory.
- b. Reference PART C DETAILED ORDER OF BATTLE BY MILITARY REGION
- (1) The <u>Unit Strength</u> column shows all units currently accepted.

 Indention reflects subordination to the next higher units. Units and
 locations which are tentatively accepted (probable only) are indicated by
 a query following each individual notation.

Examples:

(12 Army?) (Unit tentatively accepted)
(76?) Inf Div (designation is probable only)
20 (Inf?) Regt (type of unit is probable only)
(Huchou, Chekiang?) (location tentatively accepted)

Unaccepted but possible details are noted in the <u>Remarks</u> column or in parentheses following the individual notation. Numerical designations of infantry regiments of infantry divisions are determined by the "rule of three," e.g., the 11th Infantry Division has the 31st, 32d and 33d Infantry Regiments.

Available information indicates that actual strength varies from unit to unit. While this variation normally is believed to be minimal, lack of definitive information on each unit necessitates using an estimated percentage of a unit's table of organization. The estimated actual strengths of armies, independent infantry divisions/regiments, field artillery divisions/regiments, antisircraft artillery divisions/regiments, and armored divisions/tank regiments are tabulated at 95% of the newly revised TO. Strengths for remaining units are tabulated at 85% of the 1964 TOE pending completion of its evaluation. Strengths have been rounded to the nearest hundred. See Table of Organization and Equipment, Peoples Republic of China Army (U), and revisions thereto for additional details.

- (2) The <u>Location</u> column shows the most accurate location presently available for the headquarters of a particular unit, although organic elements may be dispersed in the general area. Coordinates reflect those accepted by the Board of Geographic Names.
- (3) The <u>Commander</u> column reflects confirmed, probable or possible personnel associations as indicated:

(4) The <u>Remarks</u> column includes additional pertinent information with regard to the unit, as well as personnel at regional level. Evaluations regarding personnel acceptance are the same as para b(3), above.

d. Reference PART E - UNIT INDEX:

PART B

OVERALL SIGNIFICANT TRENDS

1 April 1973

Significant Order of Battle Trends Since 1 April 1972.

a. OVERALL

- (1) OUT OF COUNTRY ACTIVITY
- (a) <u>CFNVN</u>. A few hundred military advisors and technicians continue to be accepted in NVN. A limited increase in logistical assistance was observed during the period that the NVN coastal area was mined. The current level of assistance is unknown.
- (b) <u>CFL</u>. During the past year the strength of CFL has been reduced and now is estimated at 22,000-24,000. Although the total troop strength has been reduced, there has been an unprecedented introduction of at least one PRC Army infantry regiment.
- <u>1</u> Engineers. At least four engineer regiments are believed to be deployed in Laos, totaling an estimated 12,000 men. Engineer activity during 1972 and early 1973 consisted primarily of the following six major projects:
- <u>a</u> A ferry crossing was established on the Nam (river) Ou at Muong Khoua, thus linking Chinese-built roads with North Vietnamese roads from Dien Bien Phu, <u>b</u> Route 46 was extended beyond Muong Huon to Pak Beng, <u>c</u> Routes 4 and 412 were linked to Nam Tha, <u>d</u> Construction of a road between Nam Tha and Muong Sing was completed, <u>e</u> Construction on a road from Muong Sing to the Burma border was begun.
- 2 Antiaircraft Artillery. CFL AAA, with an estimated strength of 5,000 personnel, are believed to be organized into five regiments. The current CFL AA weapon inventory, which rose to over 400 between 1969 and mid-1971, consists of about 159 37/57/85-mm and 77 AAMG weapons. Most of the AA guns are deployed between Pak Beng and Muong Huon and in the immediate Muong Huon area. The remainder are concentrated in the vicinity of Muong Beng, Muong La, Muong Sai, Nam Tha or scattered along the road network.
- 3 Infantry. At least elements of two PRC infantry regiments with an estimated strength of 4,000-6,000 men are believed to have

entered Laos sometime during 1972. The 125th Infantry Regiment, 42d Infantry Division, 14th Army reportedly moved from Muong Huon to Pak Beng during the latter part of November. The regiment apparently is divided into subordinate elements near Pak Beng in order to provide security for the road and troops in this area. Elements of the 96th Infantry Regimen*, 32d Infantry Division, 11th Army, are reported operating southwest of Muong Sai, and, like the 125th, appear to be performing a security mission.

4 Support Administrative. This category consists of an estimated 1,000 men and includes rear service, motor transport, communications and medical personnel.

(c) Burma/Thailand.

1 Information has been received that the PRC is involved in Burmese insurgency. Units in Yunnan containing ethnic minority elements, some of which are probably under the control of the 11th Army, have been identified as supporting the Burmese Communist Party (BCP). This support includes advisors and military supplies, but there are also indications that PRC regimental and battalion size units may on occasion cross over into Burma to directly assist the BCP in one of their periodic campaigns.

2 Limited evidence indicates that 200-man groups of ethnic minorities led by Han Chinese have infiltrated into Thailand via the Chinese road network in northwest Laos. These groups are also probably associated with the 11th Army. The Chinese support the Thai Communist Party (TCP) in their activities and supply limited amounts of military aid. Control of the insurgency, however, clearly is retained by the TCP.

3 It is suspected that some military installations located in at least Yunnan Province are involved in training personnel for out-of-country assignments. As a part of this activity, it is known that instruction is being given in local dialects and languages, and that both medical training and political indoctrination are also provided. It is believed that some of the facilities train foreign personnel to direct insurgency operations in their own countries.

(2) IN COUNTRY ACTIVITY

(a) Regional Forces. These forces (also called Local Defense Forces or Local Forces under the regular army) -- along with the Field Forces (also known as Main Forces) -- comprise the PRC Army.

The Regional Forces are responsible for the "first line defense" of the coast and land frontiers, and share the responsibility for the internal defense of China. Regional forces are under the command of Military Regional Headquarters but their direct subordination varies with differing roles and locations. There are instances of Military Districts and Military Sub-Districts exercising operational control and also of subordination to Field Force Armies and Divisions. Regional force combat units are in many instances deficient in combat and logistic support elements with military regions holding independent support units of regimental and battalion size for release to regional force units as the need arises.

For many years the Regional Forces consisted of Border Defense/Military Internal Security units and only one infantry-oriented TOE was carried for all units responsible for these varied tasks. Since the early 1960s, the Regional Forces have played an increasing part in coastal defense. At that time, a new type of unit named "garrison" was formed to replace many of the naval artillery units along the coast. Revetted positions gradually were built along the coast and field artillery pieces were placed in the positions vice the old, heavy, naval coastal guns.

Three separate groups of Chinese characters have been isolated as currently in use by the Chinese to express the term "garrison". For clarification purposes, standard telegraphic codes for these separate groups, as well as the type and example of organizations to which the characters probably refer are given as follows:

It is the third type of garrison unit which is listed in this order of battle and most of those thus far isolated have been along the coast; it is possible that they also exist in selected areas within the interior.

With the addition of the garrison units, there are now at least three distinct types of Regional Forces -- Garrison, Border Defense, and Internal Defense (also called Military Internal Security) -- each organized along lines best suited to accomplish its separate tasks. Following is a more detailed description of each type.

1. <u>Garrison Units</u>. As previously indicated, these forces are mainly charged with the defense of the coast and are deployed in static fortified positions along the coast and on the many offshore islands. The garrison units are well-equipped with field and AA artillery and heavy infantry weapons, and on the coastal area, have patrol and supply boats. They possess a good observation, reconnaissance and patrol capability in addition to their formidable firepower. In contrast, however, these units have few infantry troops, even fewer vehicles and possess minimal mobility. They are tailored to suit their mission and the topography. Regiments are self-contained and division headquarters and support units are small. The PRC consider them as their "first line of defense" along the coastal area; their role is to protect the immediate rea, keep a thorough watch for invaders, raiders, infiltrators and defectors; define, contain and attempt to destroy immediately any invading

or raiding force. The close cooperation in training between field force and garrison units indicates that in the event of an invasion, field force units would assume command of garrison units in their sector. Garrison units previously have been mentioned in the order of battle under the title of Border Defense. Now, all units deployed along the coastline which previously were labelled BD have been redesignated garrison concurrent with this issue of the PRC Army order of battle.

2. Border Defense Units. These forces, mostly regiments, also are "first line of defense" units and are tasked with defending China's land frontier. They are considered differently from those along the coast. Stationary fortifications would be of little use and the principal requirement is for checkpoints on main routes and for lightly armed infantry units supported by some light artillery. Most of the organic transport is by animal in order to cope with rough terrain and remote border frontiers. As long distance movement is a remote contingency for these units, they hold very few vehicles. Border Defense regiments are self-contained and only in a few cases are formed into divisions. These units are sometimes called infantry -- which basically is what they are.

Border defense units are largely responsible for the political control and policing of international border areas, for the initial defense against an invading force as well as for preventing subversion from across the border. Units contain large political and intelligence elements and have organic political work groups for indoctrination and political supervision of the local inhabitants, especially ethnic groups.

3. Internal Defense Units. These lightly armed infantry forces are also known as Military Internal Security units and are so listed in this issue. Their main responsibility is the internal defense and security of China. In peacetime, they carry out largely a policing role, but in wartime are capable of conducting defensive and guerrilla operations in the interior of China. They are deployed mainly in minority areas and large cities in the defense of key military installations and personalities. Several additional

divisions have been formed as a result of the transfer of the People's Armed Police units to military control during the past few years. Future publications of the OB may well list these "Military Internal Security" forces as "Internal Defense", a translation of the Chinese characters used to describe these forces.

- (b) <u>Sino-Soviet Border</u>. Improvement of defenses in Sinkiang was noted during the period. Three infantry divisions now are listed in Sinkiang along the major approaches to China proper. Combat and combat support units there suggest the possibility of an army headquarters located in the area for their command and control. Few changes have been noted in the other border regions; however, some limited improvements were reported.
- (c) Airborne Units. A re-examination of what was listed previously as the 15th Army, an infantry unit, has resulted in its now being held as the 15th Airborne Army. Its units have been trained and equipped for the movement of both parachute delivered and air landed troops by transport aircraft. Helicopters are also available in the area and it is possible that some of these troops have been trained in heliborne operations. Doctrine for combat airborne operations dictates employment of paratroop elements in hostile rear defensive zones. The main body of troops are subsequently airlanded to continue operations. The 1st Airborne Division continues to be carried as independent on a tentative basis; it probably was not involved in the reorganization that resulted in the formation of the 15th Airborne Army. All of the above units, as well as some others located in Wuhan MR, probably have had parachute training, but the 1st Airborne Division (Indep?) is probably the only unit using parachate delivery as the primary means of force insertion. Military airborne activity reported elsewhere in China is believed to reflect demonstrations or training exercises of elements of the above units. The 15th Airborne Army, together with the 1st Airborne Division (Indep?), is headquartered in Wuhan MR, and thought to be subordinate to the Air Force.

Airborne tactics lend range, flexibility and control to PLA forces in either internal security or offensive roles. Limitations are imposed on PLA airborne operations by the critical lack of adequate transport aircraft.

- (d) 49th Infantry Division. The 49th Infantry Division previously was suspected to be organic to the 11th Army, Kunming MR. However, it now has been determined that this army's organic divisions are designated the 31st, 32d and 33d. Because no independent infantry divisions are known to exist in Kunming MR, it would be usual to list this unit in the Unlocated, China category. However, several U/I infantry divisions currently are accepted in the order of battle, and it is felt likely that one of them probably represents the 49th. Therefore, rather than increase the overall inventory by one infantry division, the 49th Infantry Division will be held as a possible equation for each of the U/I infantry divisions.
- (e) <u>Miscellaneous Troops</u>. A planned revision of miscellaneous troop strengths within each military region has not yet been accomplished. It is likely that the strengths generally are low. A detailed study of these troops is expected to get underway and is hoped to be completed in the near future.
- (f) Additional Trends. Some expansion of combat and combat support units has been underway in the PRC ground forces, as stated in previous publications. Most obvious is the addition of five divisions and six regiments in the AAA category -- likely formed during the past three years. It also appears that a few armies, or army-level commands, have been activated by using one or two already established infantry divisions, with the remaining division (or divisions) being formed by using cadre from already organized field force and regional units. Recruits probably provide fillers for the newly formed units. Concurrent with the formation of these divisions is a possible redesignation using the "rule-of-three". Whether or not designations of all divisions will be so numbered cannot be determined at this time.

CHENGTU MILITARY REGION

Significant order of battle trends since 1 April 1972:

- 1. <u>Unidentified Antiaircraft Artillery Regiment</u>. An U/I AAA
 Regiment is listed as independent and possibly organic to Chengtu MR Headquarters. The addition of this unit to the regional inventory results from
 an assessment of data indicating a pattern of locating such units in or near
 MR headquarters.
- 2. <u>lst Railway Engineer Division</u>. Elements of this division possibly are in northeastern Szechwan Province. The division formerly was carried tentatively in Kunming MR but its major elements probably are now in northwestern Hupeh with lesser elements in Szechwan and Shensi Provinces.
- 3. More Detailed Locations for Units. Infantry units in Szechwan Province and Tibet AR and three railway engineer divisions and a motor transport regiment in Szechwan Province are more precisely located as a result of new information.
- 4. 305th Engineer Regiment. A national designator -- 305 -- has been equated with a formerly unidentified engineer regiment in the Jihkatse area, Tibet.

Significant order of battle trends since 1 April 1972:

1. <u>26th Army</u>. The status of the 26th Army is unclear. There are tenuous indications that a third infantry division is being formed within this army's area of responsibility. However, until it can be determined that this does not merely represent a relocation of an accepted organic element --possibly of the 77th Infantry Division -- no change in army composition will be accepted.

In addition, with the tentative acceptance of a 33d Infantry Division organic to the 11th Army, Kunming MR, the unit previously so designated as organic to the 26th Army will be listed as unidentified. It will continue to be carried as such until it can be determined that (1) duplicate national designators are assigned to infantry divisions, (2) the unit was redesignated the 78th to conform with the "rule-of-three" pattern normally accepted for infantry divisions organic to army headquarters or (3) the unit deployed to Kunming MR and was replaced by another infantry division -- possibly designated the 78th.

The 76th Infantry Division, previously carried as organic to the 26th Army, is now accepted tentatively as independent. This division deployed to the Nanchang area, Kiangsi Province, Fuchou MR during the Cultural Revolution and has remained there. As a result of this change in status, the strength of the 26th Army is decreased by 12,000.

- 2. <u>Unidentified Antiaircraft Artillery Division</u>. An unidentified AAA division is now accepted in Chinan MR. This represents the first AAA division to be listed in the regional inventory.
- 3. <u>Border Defense/Garrison Units</u>. Border Defense units deployed along the coast have been redesignated Garrison as explained in PART B,

 <u>Overall Significant Trends</u>. Also, an additional garrison division has been tentatively accepted. As a result, six garrison divisions are now accepted in the military region inventory.

FUCHOU MILITARY REGION

Significant order of battle trends since 1 April 1972:

- 1. 28th/29th/31st Armies. The movement of the 28th Army to southern Shansi in early 1970 was thought to have included the entire army. Since then, however, reports indicate the possibility that the 84th Infantry Division remained in Fuchou MR as part of the 29th Army and the 92d Infantry Division (31st Army) moved to southern Shansi, instead. Such a possibility is indicated in the detailed order of battle. Confirmation of these possible changes is not presently available.
- 2. 76th/215th Infantry Divisions. Continued subordination of these divisions to the 26th and 55th Armies, respectively, cannot be verified. Therefore, the divisions are listed as independent on a tentative basis. Cultural Revolution disruptions required additional troops for Kiangsi Province where only Local Defense units previously had predominated. The 76th Infantry Division has been responsible for northern Kiangsi since that time; on the other hand, the 215th Infantry Division, in late 1968/early 1969, replaced 41st Army elements in southern Kiangsi. It was during the latter time that the 41st and 55th Armies were rotated.
- 3. Antiaircraft Artillery Divisions. Deployment of three AAA divisions in Fukien Province still remains questionable. Subordination of the unidentified division also is unconfirmed -- it may be an Air Force, not an Army unit.
- 4. <u>Garrison/Border Defense Units</u>. All BD units (three divisions and two regiments) previously listed in Fuchou MR now are considered as garrison type units. Additionally, two garrison regiments are newly accepted -- in the Kengyuan area and Chiuchen, Fukien, respectively.
- 5. Engineer Units. An unidentified engineer regiment is listed in Fukien Province; its specific location is unknown. An unidentified engineer regiment was deleted from the Unlocated, China category to account for the Listing in Fukien.

FUCHOU MILITARY REGION (Cont'd)

6. Motor Transport Units. Three additional motor transport regiments (1st, 8th, and U/I) are accepted in Fuchou MR, making a total of eight regiments in the region. The 8th Regiment previously had been unlocated in China. The possibility that some of the regiments are civilian organizations cannot be discounted. Even so, civilian controlled units could easily augment those of the army -- if need be. Widespread use of motor transport is required in Fuchou MR due to its terrain and inadequate railway system.

Significant order of battle trends since 1 April 1972:

- 1. 215th/Unidentified Infantry Divisions. The 215th Infantry
 Division, previously accepted as organic to the 55th Army, now is listed
 tentatively as independent. This division deployed to the Kanchou/Chian area
 of Kiangsi Province, Fuchou MR during the Cultural Revolution and has remained
 there. Since an U/I Infantry Division tentatively is located in Shantou,
 Kwangtung, it is being provisionally accepted as organic to the 55th Army.
 Therefore, there has been no strength change for this army.
- 2. <u>Unidentified Antiaircraft Artillery Division</u>. Additional information has provided a location for this unit. Previously accepted only in Kuangchou MR, it can now be listed on a tentative basis in the Chechiang area of Hunan Province.
- 3. Border Defense/Garrison/Military Internal Security Units.
 Two border defense divisions and three border defense regiments have been redesignated as garrison units in line with the accepted change in terminology for border defense units deployed along the coastline. See Part B, Overall Significant Trends for details. In addition, two garrison regiments (153d and U/I) have been newly accepted on Hainan Island -- though they are not believed to be newly formed.

Consistent with the trend previously observed throughout the PRC, of deploying MIS divisions at provincial capitals, two such units are now accepted on a tentative basis in Nanning, Kwangsi and Changsha, Hunan. A previously accepted independent MIS regiment in Nanning has been subordinated to the MIS division located there.

4. <u>Unidentified Motor Transport Regiment</u>. The U/I MT Regiment at Ningming, Kwangsi may be designated the 41st. Although unconfirmed, this MT regiment is, nevertheless, being deleted from the Unlocated, China category and suggested as a possible designation for the Ningming unit. This is being done on the basis of 40-series MT regiments which appear to be allocated to Kuangchou MR.

5. <u>Hainan Island</u>. With the acceptance of two infantry divisions and the 21st Garrison Division on Hainan Island, the possibility exists that an army-level Hainan Area Command has been organized. Also, tenuous evidence indicates the likelihood that the island has been redesignated a military district within Kuangchou MR and is no longer a part of Kwangtung MD.

Pending additional data, however, neither of the above organizational/administrative changes are accepted.

Significant order of battle trends since 1 April 1972:

- 1. 11th Army. Confirmation of the activation of the 11th Army and more detailed locations for its component elements are now available. The army is believed to be composed of the 31st, 32d, and probably the 33d Divisions -- unit designations previously assigned to divisions of the 12th, 16th and 26th Armies, respectively. Although there is a possibility that some personnel of the divisions of the 11th Army may have come from the other three listed armies, it is more likely that they were formed from various field and local forces in Kunming MR. There are hints that the PRC in their recent restructuring of their army again are renumbering their armies to follow the "rule-of-three", as they were when first formed.
- 2. Antiaircraft Artillery Division. Another unidentified AAA division is added to the Kunming MR OB listing and is tentatively accepted in the Mengtzu area of Yunnan Province. A total of two divisions and one regiment currently are located in the region.
- 3. Military Internal Security Division. An internal security unit is tentatively accepted in the Kweiyang area of Kweichow. Whether or not the 22d MIS Regiment, located in the same area, is subordinate to the division cannot be determined at this time.
- 4. <u>Chemical Warfare Unit</u>. An unidentified Anti-Chemical Warfare Regiment located in the Kunming area of Yunnan is added to the Kunming MR listing. A total of two anti-chemical warfare regiments now are identified in the OB -- the other being located in Kuangchou MR.
- 5. Engineer Regiment. A newly accepted engineer regiment is tentatively listed in the Kunming MR inventory in the Tungchuan area of Yunnan. Only one other engineer regiment is accepted in the region; however, it is suspected that additional engineer units are located there.
- 6. Motor Transport Regiments. A total of eight MT regiments is shown in the region -- two (1st and 21st) of which are newly accepted. As with some other MT listings, it is possible that certain of them may be

civilian organizations. Even if this is so, the regiments under civilian control could be used for military projects. With the out-of-country involvements of the region, it is likely that civilian organized MT regiments are under the authority of the military even if only indirectly.

7. Railway Engineer Division. Railway activity in Kunming MR has declined to a point that only one railway engineer division is listed there and on a tentative basis. The 1st Division is believed to have transferred to western Hupeh province with elements probably spread out through southern Shensi and northeastern Szechwan along the projected railway.

- 1. <u>21st Army</u>. One organic division of this army probably is located at Tienshui, Kansu. This is about 100 miles west of the Army Hqs which tentatively is accepted in the Paochi area of Shensi. Sufficient information is lacking, however, to specifically identify the division at this time.
- 2. 47th Army. Elements of the 47th Army, presently accepted in the Hsian area, Shensi, may be in Kansu Province. This move, if confirmed, may presage a general westward movement of the 47th Army to bolster the defenses of the Kansu Corridor area.
- 3. Unidentified Antiaircraft Artillery Division/Unidentified
 Antiaircraft Artillery Regiment. Two AAA units have been accepted in the order of battle inventory: an U/I AAA Division in the Changyeh area, Kansu and an U/I AAA Regiment at Lanchou, Kansu. The regiment may possibly be organic to MR headquarters in accordance with the general pattern of siting such units at these headquarters.
- 4. Three Unidentified Military Internal Security Divisions. U/I MIS Divisions are tentatively accepted at Hsian, Shensi; Yinchuan, Ninghsia; and Hsining, Tsinghai. Together with the U/I MIS Division already tentatively accepted at Lanchou, Kansu, each of the provincial capitals in the MR now has a MIS Division.
- 5. 2d/6th/7th Engineer Regiments. Recent information can no longer substantiate the existence of these engineer regiments in the MR and, consequently, they have been moved to the Unlocated, China category.
- 6. 77th Motor Transport Regiment. The location of this motor transport regiment is refined on the basis of more recent information and now is accepted at Tunhuang, Kansu. This unit is involved in supply operations on the highway connecting Kansu, Tsinghai, and Tibet AR.
- 7. <u>lst Railway Engineer Division</u>. Elements of this division possibly are in both southern Shensi, Lanchou MR and northeast Szechwan.

Significant order of battle trends since 1 April 1972:

- 1. 12th Army. With the acceptance of the 31st Infantry Division as organic to the 11th Army, Kunming MR, it is being deleted from the 12th Army inventory. The previously listed 31th Infantry Division of the 12th Army will be listed as U/I until it can be determined whether (1) duplicative designations exist for infantry divisions, (2) the unit was redesignated the 36th to conform with the "rule-of-three" or (3) the unit deployed to Kunming MR and was replaced by another division -- possibly designated the 36th.
- 2. 22nd Army/Choushan Garrison Command. It is now accepted that the 22d Army has been reorganized and redesignated the Choushan Garrison Command. The status of the 22d Army had been unclear for sometime. Indications of its change from a field force to a coastal defense role -- possibly as early as the mid-1960s, periodically have been received. These reports included numerous references to an increasing emphasis on Field Artillery -- a primary organizational characteristic of garrison units. It is only as a result of an accumulation of sufficient data, however, that such a reorganization could be accepted. With the listing of the Choushan Garrison Command Headquarters and three U/I Garrison Divisions, the 22d Army and its organic 64th, 65th and 66th Infantry Divisions have been deleted from both the Nanching MR and Overall PRC inventory.
- 3. 60th Army. A re-evaluation of the 60th Army has resulted in the tentative acceptance of the Army Headquarters and the 179th Infantry Division in Nanching, Kiangsu and the 181st Infantry Division in Anhwei Province. In addition, limited evidence suggests elements of this army may have deployed to Peiching MR. Lack of sufficient data, however, preclude acceptance at this time.
- 4. 9th Artillery Division. Although the specific location of the 9th Artillery Division within Nanching MR in unknown, recent data allow it now to be accepted as unlocated within Kiangsu Province, vice the MR.

Significant order of battle trends since 1 April 1972:

1. 28th/31st/60th Armies. Limited data indicates that the 84th Infantry Division may have stayed in Fuchou MR while the remainder of the 28th Army deployed to Shansi Province in early 1970. Reports suggest at least elements of the 92d Infantry Division, 31st Army -- currently accepted in Fuchou MR -- may have deployed north with the 28th Army instead.

In addition, unconfirmed data suggests that elements of the 60th Army, Nanching MR may be in Peiching MR.

Pending confirmation of all the above, however, no changes on status will be made regarding the 84th and 92d Infantry Divisions and the 60th Army.

- 2. <u>lst Armored Division</u>. The 2d Independent Tank Regiment is now tentatively accepted as organic to the 1st Armored Division. With the deletion of this unit from the independent tank regiment inventory, three such units remain in Peiching MR.
- 3. Antiaircraft Artillery Units. An U/I AAA Division has now been identified in Kaocheng, Hopeh. With its acceptance, two AAA divisions are currently listed in the Peiching MR inventory. In addition, a AAA regiment is now accepted tentatively as organic to the MR headquarters.
- 4. Border Defense/Military Internal Security Units. Two U/I
 MIS Divisions -- at Shihchiachuang, Hopeh and Taiyuan, Shansi, respectively
 -- have been identified tentatively in Peiching MR. With their inclusion in
 the inventory, an MIS division is now listed in each of the three provincial
 capitals, and a total of four are accepted in the military region.

In addition, two independent border defense regiments and two independent MIS regiments have been included in the regional inventory. While these represent the first BD/MIS regimental units to be identified in the MR, they are not believed to have been newly formed nor represent the only such units in the region.

Significant order of battle trends since 1 April 1972:

- 1. 16th Army. A 32d Infantry Division currently is accepted as organic to the 11th Army, Kunming MR. The unit previously so designated as subordinate to the 16th Army will be listed as U/I pending confirmation that (1) it deployed to Kunming MR and was replaced by another infantry division -- possibly designated the 48th, (2) the unit was redesignated the 48th to conform with the "rule-of-three" pattern normally accepted for infantry divisions organic to Army Hqs, or (3) duplicative national designators exist for infantry units and, therefore, a 32d Infantry Division remains organic to the 16th Army.
- 2. 23d Army. It now has been determined that an artillery regiment is organic to the 23d Army Headquarters. The strength of the army is, therefore, increased by 1,000.

Recent data has suggested that U/I elements of the 73d Infantry Division may be in Luta, Liaoning. Pending additional information, however, this is not yet accepted.

- 3. 64th Army. A re-evaluation of previously held data, in addition to limited, but more recent reporting, has resulted in a tentative refinement of the 64th Army's location. As a result, it now is accepted on a probable basis in the Penchi vice Shenyang area of Liaoning Province.
- 4. Artillery Units. Lack of recent evidence has dictated that the location of the 7th Artillery Division no longer be listed on a confirmed basis. However, the unit will continue to be accepted tentatively in the Luta area, Liaoning.

A third independent artillery regiment has been added to the Shenyang MR inventory. It tentatively is accepted in Shenyang, Liaoning.

5. Antiaircraft Artillery Units. An U/I AAA Division and one independent AAA regiment -- possibly organic to the Military Region Head-quarters -- recently have been identified in Shenyang MR. They represent the first such units to be accepted in the regional inventory.

6. Border Defense/Garrison/Military Internal Security Units.

As explained in Part B, Overall Significant Trends, BD units deployed along the coastline have been redesignated garrison. As a result, the previously listed BD Division, Changshan Tao Group, Liaoning, has been so changed.

In addition, the BD Division accepted in the Lushun-Luta area of Liaoning has been reassessed to be an MIS Division. As a result of these redesignations, only independent BD regiments are accepted in the Shenyang MR inventory.

A tentative acceptance of an U/I MIS Division, Changchun,
Kirin -- together with the above redesignation -- now results in the listing
of four such divisions in Shenyang MR. In addition, an U/I BD Regiment,
Tashihtou, Kirin, also has been added to the regional inventory making a

For command/control of these units -- in addition to the combat support units mentioned in item 2, below -- it is possible that an Army Headquarters exists. Pending additional information, however, none is accepted at this time in the military region. The location of one of the previously accepted infantry divisions -- the 4th -- has been refined and is now listed in the Kuche area.
- 2. <u>Unidentified Tank/Artillery/Antiaircraft Artillery Regiments</u>. These units, each newly accepted in the order of battle, are located in the Wulumuchi area, Sinkiang. The AAA regiment possibly is organic to MR Head-quarters.
- 3. <u>Unidentified Cavalry Division/Regiment</u>. An U/I Cavalry Division has been newly accepted in the Chitai area, Sinkiang, bringing to two the total of such units in the MR. This new unit is comprised of three cavalry regiments previously carried as independent. In addition, an U/I Independent Cavalry Regiment has also been newly accepted in the Chaosu area, Sinkiang.
- 4. <u>lst/Unidentified Engineer Regiment</u>. These two units are accepted in the order of battle, increasing the total of such units in the MR to three. The lst Engineer Regiment is located at Sanchiaochuan/Wulumuchi, and the U/I Regiment is at Niloko, Sinkiang.

Significant order of battle trends since 1 April 1972:

- 1. 15th Army/15th Airborne Army/1st Airborne Division. The 15th Army, previously listed as an infantry unit (strength 39,000) under the ground forces, is now accepted as having been reorganized into the 15th Airborne Army (strength 29,000) subordinate to the Air Force. Each of its three divisions -- the 29th, the 44th, and the 45th -- has an air transportable capability. The 1st Airborne Division probably was not involved in the abovementioned reorganization and is therefore carried as an independent unit subordinate to the Air Force.
- 2. <u>Unidentified Army</u>. An U/I Army is newly accepted in Hupeh Province, bringing the total number of armies in the MR to five. Countrywide the MR now is surpassed by only two MRs in total armies -- Peiching with eight and Shenyang with six.
- 3. <u>Unidentified Infantry Division</u>. An U/I independent infantry division is now listed in Mingchiang, Honan in lieu of the previously accepted 45th Infantry Division. The latter unit -- organic to the 15th Airborne Army -- is now listed in Huangpei, Hupeh.
- 4. <u>Unidentified Artillery Regiment</u>. An independent artillery regiment has been accepted in Wuhan MR on the basis of newly acquired information.
- 5. <u>Unidentified Antiaircraft Artillery Regiment</u>. This unit, newly accepted in the order of battle, is tenuously located in the Wuchang area, Hupeh. It is possibly organic to MR Headquarters.
- 6. 2d Engineer Regiment. Following a reassessment of available data, this regiment, formerly listed tentatively in the Chiuchuan area, Kansu, now is tentatively shown in the Chungyang area, Hupeh.
- 7. <u>Unidentified Motor Transport Regiment</u>. This regiment is newly accepted in Wuhan MR and is the only such unit in the MR.

- The following units have been deleted from the Unlocated,
 China category:
- a. <u>U/I/2d Airborne Divisions</u>. These units were listed tentatively in previous orders of battle. With the reorganization of the 15th Army into an airborne army, however, it has been determined that they are duplicative of two of the airborne army's organic air transportable divisions. Therefore, the U/I and 2d Airborne Divisions have been deleted from the order of battle inventory.
- b. <u>U/I Engineer Regiment</u>. An engineer regiment, not yet identified, is accepted in Fuchou MR. The previously listed unlocated engineer regiment therefore, is removed from the unlocated category.
- c. <u>8th/41st Motor Transport Regiments</u>. These two motor transport regiments are accepted in Fuchou and Kuangchou MRs, respectively, on the basis of recent information and are deleted from the Unlocated, China category.
- 2. The following units have been added to the Unlocated, China, category:

2d/6th/7th Engineer Regiments. These three engineer regiments have been deleted from the Lanchou MR and are now listed in the Unlocated, China category.

3. With the deletion of the five above-mentioned units -- partially offset by the addition of three engineer units -- total number of troops listed under the Unlocated, China category is reduced from 103,900 to 86,700. This reduced figure may be misleading to the reader. Because of Chinese security and the large number of troop movements either for training or a transfer, it is difficult to recognize or prove some unit locations -- hence, there are many units listed as "tentative" and "possible" within the Military Regions portion of this order of battle. These units generally are so listed on the basis of data that are considered reliable but incomplete. Unless additional


