(Summary of Changes Since 1 October 1968)

1. The strength of the Chinese Communist Army (CCA) is estimated at 2,379,500 as of 1 May 1969. The CCA consists of 34 army headquarters, 176 divisions, 128 independent regiments and miscellaneous troops. Included in the divisions are 120 combat (109 infantry, 5 armored, 3 cavalry, 3 airborne), 21 border defense/military internal security, 24 artillery (15 FA, 3 AT, 6 AAA) and 11 railway engineer divisions which are considered service support. Of the 128 independent regiments, 15 are combat, 27 are border/internal defense, 17 are artillery and the remaining 69 are engineer, signal and service support. In addition to the independent regiments, there are 15 FA and 7 AAA regiments which are organic to army and/or military region headquarters. During the period 1 October 1968 - 1 May 1969, the estimated strength has increased by 14,600. This change is attributable to the overall increase of two antiaircraft artillery regiments, one border defense regiment, an engineer regiment, a signal regiment and an infantry division in lieu of a regiment. The change of status of an infantry division and an infantry regiment from independent to an organic status helps to offset the above acceptances.

2. Order of battle developments and significant military trends are summarized below:

a. Involvement in the Cultural Revolution (CR) previously was indicated for the PLA (Army). Several armies, or major elements thereof, were relocated to cope with problems related to the CR. In order of priority, the reasons for these movements are believed to have been dictated by a desire. (1) to improve internal security through augmentation of troops and political indoctrination (2) to ameliorate their strategic capability and (3) to prevent local

ORDER OF BATTLE NOTES (U)

(Summary of Changes Since 1 October 1968)

1. The strength of the Chinese Communist Army (CCA) is estimated at 2,379,500 as of 1 May 1969. The CCA consists of 34 army headquarters, 176 divisions, 128 independent regiments and miscellaneous troops. During the period 1 October 1968 - 1 May 1969, the estimated strength has increased by 14,600. This change is attributable to the overall increase of two antiaircraft artillery regiments, one border defense regiment, an engineer regiment, a signal regiment and an infantry division in lieu of a regiment. The change of status of an infantry division and an infantry regiment from independent to an organic status helps to offset the above acceptances.

2. Order of battle developments and significant military trends are summarized below:

a. Involvement in the Cultural Revolution (CR) previously was indicated for the PLA (Army). Several armies, or major elements thereof, were relocated to cope with problems related to the CR. The 38 Army moved from Shenyang Military Region to the Peiching/Faoting, Hopeh area in March 1967 and replaced the 69 Army; the 69 Army, at that time, moved to Taiyuan, Shansi and replaced the 21 Army which moved westward to the Hsian area of Shensi.

Reliable information is now available to confirm the relocation of the 50 Army from Antung, Liaoning to Chengtu, Szechwan. It appears that this movement took place in May 1967. At approximately the same time, at least elements of the 130 Infantry Division, 54 Army moved southeastward from Yaan into the Ipin area of Szechwan.

At least some elements of the 43 Army possibly have transferred from Hainan Island to the South China mainland of the Canton Military Region. It is suspected that these elements moved into Kwangsi. The 141 Infantry Division, 47 Army deployed from Kwangsi to the Changsha, Hunan area and it is doubtful that the Chinese Communists would leave a vacuum in such a strategically located province.

b. Because of additional civil and security commitments, the Chinese Communists have found it necessary to augment and reorganize some of their forces.

Another infantry division, the 53, has been reactivated in Tibet, making a total of three in the region. The division probably was formed mostly from troops already in the area, although the 158 Infantry Regiment is its only subordinate unit specifically identified. The remaining two subordinate infantry regiments could have come from the two independent infantry and/or five border defense (BD) regiments already in the area. BD regiments in Tibet were formed from the 50-series divisions when they were deactivated in mid-1959. Additional artillery elements probably were moved into the area for the formation of the division's artillery regiments.

favoritism by the PLA. More definitive information now clarifies the timing and scope of some of these movements which were discussed in previous orders of battle.

The 38 Army moved from Shenyang Military Region to the Peiching/Faoting, Hopeh area in March 1967 and replaced the 69 Army; the 69 Army, at that time, moved to Taiyuan, Shansi and replaced the 21 Army which moved westward to the Hsian area of Shensi.

BD regiments in Tibet were formed from the 50-series divisions when they were deactivated in mid-1959. Additional artillery elements probably were moved into the area for the formation of the division's artillery regiments.

There are tenuous indications that the 54 Infantry Division and the 18 Army headquarters also have been reactivated. The 18 Army, with the 52, 53 and 54 Infantry Divisions as component units, was active in Tibet from 1951 until mid-1959 when it was deactivated. There has been some regrouping and movement of troops in Tibet, and it would not be unlikely for the army and the 54 Division to be reconstituted; however, further information is required to confirm such a change.

A possible reactivation has been reported in Fuchou Military Region. Although unconfirmed, the 29 Army reportedly has been reconstituted in Fukien province in the Fuchou area. The unit had been inactivated in early 1952 -- personnel from its divisions were used to form a BD division. It is suspected that at least some BD units in Fukien would act as the nucleus for the 29 Army, if it does exist. Further information is needed to determine its status.

Another division, possibly Military Internal Security, is reportedly located in the Nanchang, Kiangsi area of Fuchou Military Region. Lack of information as to its type and existence, precludes its acceptance at this time.

c. The 3 Railway Engineer Division is accepted in the Tahsingaling area of Heilungkiang Province, Shenyang Military Region. This unit, together with the 9 Railway Engineer Division, is believed to be engaged in railroad construction and forestry projects in the Khingan Mountain area. Prior to its move to the Northeast, the Division has been listed in the Unlocated China category since April 1965 -- at which time its existence in Hunan Province, Canton Military Region could no longer be substantiated.

The continued acceptance of the 4 Railway Engineer Division in Anhwei Province, Nanching Military Region can no longer be substantiated. Therefore, the unit is being placed in the Unlocated China category.

d. An unidentified signal regiment is now listed in Linchih in

troops have a signal regiment + one battalion. Tibet Military Region is the first region which does not fit into such a category and, therefore, it may be indicative that all regions may have a regiment vice battalion. Further information is needed to determine the status of signal units in the remaining five regional headquarters now listed with an organic battalion rather than a regiment.

e. Based on a re-examination, an unidentified independent Border Defense Regiment is accepted at Hulin, Heilungkiang, Shenyang Military Region. The strength of the unit is estimated to be 2,000. With this acceptance, two border defense divisions, plus two border defense regiments are carried in the military region.

f. Two independent tank regiments, previously listed as unlocated, now are accepted at Tatung, Shanxi and Hsian, Shensi in the Peiching and Lanchou Military Regions, respectively. The latter location is listed on a tentative basis. The regiments are estimated to have a strength of 1,900 each.

g. Two Motor Transport Regiments -- the 12 and an unidentified (possibly the 45) -- have been accepted at Chuhsiang, Yunnan, Kunming Military Region, and unlocated within the Peiching Military Region, respectively. Both regiments, each with a strength of 1,600, previously were listed in the Unlocated China category.

h. An Antiaircraft Artillery (AAA) Regiment is accepted as organic to the 67 Army Headquarters located at Chingtao, Shantung in the Tsinan Military Region. As a result of this acceptance, the Army's strength is estimated at 39,500.

In addition, an AAA Regiment is believed to be organic to Kunming Military Region Headquarters at Kunming, Yunnan. This suggests that an AAA regiment might be organic to the headquarters of at least part of the remaining military regions, but at this time insufficient information precludes their acceptance.

Tibet Military Region. As indicated in a previous order of battle, it appears that at least those regions which have large concentrations of troops have a signal regiment vice battalion. Tibet Military Region is the first region which does not fit into such a category and, therefore, it may be indicative that all regions may have a regiment vice battalion. Further information is needed to determine the status of signal units in the remaining four regional headquarters now listed with an organic battalion rather than a regiment.

e. Based on a re-examination, an unidentified independent Border Defense Regiment is accepted at Halin, Hailungkiang, Shenyang Military Region. The strength of the unit is estimated to be 2,000. With this acceptance, two border defense divisions, plus two border defense regiments are carried in the military region.

f. Two independent tank regiments, previously listed as unlocated, now are accepted at Tatung, Shanxi and Hsian, Shensi in the Peiching and Lanchow Military Regions, respectively. The latter location is listed on a tentative basis. The regiments are estimated to have a strength of 1,900 each.

g. Two Motor Transport Regiments -- the 12 and an unidentified (possibly the 45) -- have been accepted at Chuhsiung, Yunnan, Kunming Military Region, and unlocated within the Peiching Military Region, respectively. Both regiments, each with a strength of 1,600, previously were listed in the Unlocated China category.

h. An Antiaircraft Artillery (AAA) Regiment is accepted as organic to the 67 Army Headquarters located at Chingtao, Shantung in the Tsinan Military Region. As a result of this acceptance, the Army's strength is estimated at 39,500.

In addition, an AAA Regiment is believed to be organic to Kunming Military Region Headquarters at Kunming, Yunnan. This suggests that an AAA regiment might be organic to the headquarters of at least part

i. One additional engineer regiment is now accepted in both Tibet and Lanchou Military Regions. The former is located in the Jihkatse area where it reportedly is working on an airfield; the latter probably is in the Hsiam area. Shensi -- its mission is unknown. Though both regiments are listed as unidentified, it is possible that the one located in Shensi represents the 20 Engineer Regiment which was previously listed in the Unlocated China category. The unit in Tibet was not listed previously.

j. The military rank structure of the PLA was abolished in 1965, but the rank an individual had held was still a fairly reliable indicator of his importance through the end of 1966. The course of the Cultural Revolution through 1967 to the present, however, indicates that prior military rank no longer accurately reflects individual importance. Therefore, rank designations have been eliminated from the current Order of Battle, since they can tend to be misleading. An individual's former rank may be found in DIA publication Chinese Communist Military Personalities.

Diacritical marks and Standard Telegraphic Codes (STC) for all personalities are included under SECTION IV

k. Recent clashes with Soviet troops in the Chen Pao Island area between Heilungkiang Province and the USSR, as well as similar clashes reported at various border locations since 1960, apparently have not led to an introduction of additional Chinese troops to the northern frontiers. There have been no discernible indications of either major intra-regional deployments or a large increase of troops into Shenyang, Sinkiang or Inner Mongolia Military Regions. While an unidentified border defense regiment is newly accepted in Hulin, Heilungkiang -- near Chen Pao Island -- its presence is believed to reflect neither a newly formed nor a recently deployed unit; rather, it is the result of a reevaluation of information.

With the inclusion of the above, six armies and one military region currently are listed with organic AAA regiments at headquarters level.

i. One additional engineer regiment is now accepted in both Tibet and Lanchou Military Regions. The former is located in the Jihkatse area where it reportedly is working on an airfield; the latter probably is in the Hsian area. Shensi -- its mission is unknown. Though both regiments are listed as unidentified, it is possible that the one located in Shensi represents the 20 Engineer Regiment which was previously listed in the Unlocated China category. The unit in Tibet was not listed previously.

j. The military rank structure of the PLA was abolished in 1965, but the rank an individual had held was still a fairly reliable indicator of his importance through the end of 1966. The course of the Cultural Revolution through 1967 to the present, however, indicates that prior military rank no longer accurately reflects individual importance. Therefore, rank designations have been eliminated from the current Order of Battle, since they can tend to be misleading. An individual's former rank may be found in DIA publication Chinese Communist Military Personalities.

By early 1966, the estimated strength of Chinese Forces, Laos (CFL) was believed to have approached 1,200 i.e., a "reinforced" battalion. Indications of continuing and expanding Chinese involvement in construction-related activities since September 1968 principally in the areas of Phong Saly/Ban Botene/Muong Sai/Muong La has led to a current strength estimate of between 5,000 and 7,000 men. It is believed that this force is comprised of military cadre to oversee civilian laborers, military construction units, security troops and an unknown number of AAA personnel to protect construction sites. It is also possible that some Chinese personnel are assigned as advisors to the Pathet Lao.

n. It has been suggested that both Inner Mongolia and Tibet Military




