

Egypt:

Terrorists Attack Passenger Train (U)

(U) Gunmen opened fire on a passenger train on 18 November, killing two train workers and injuring several passengers. The attack took place about 576 kilometers south of Cairo on the Aswan-Cairo route, near the location of previous attacks on 7 and 8 November. No group has claimed responsibility, but the Islamic Group (IG), which carried out the earlier attacks, is likely responsible. While no specific, credible threats against US interests exist, the IG, in an 8 November statement, warned foreign tourists to leave Egypt immediately because it was pursuing a campaign of violence against tourist targets. This third passenger train attack demonstrates that the IG is holding to its threat, and represents an escalation in IG operations.
