Academy at West Point equivalent), Nicaraguan Army (EN), took place. Nicaraguan President Daniel ((Ortega)) Saaved ra and General Julio Cesar ((AVILES)) Castillo, Chief, Head of Defense (CHOD), presided over the ceremony, accompanied by several high-level Government of Nicaragua (GoN) officials. As is the usual norm, Ortega castigated U.S. policies, however, this time softening his rhetoric. 2. (U//FOUO) On 10 December 2013, fifty (50) Nicaraguan cadets were commissioned as new Nicaraguan Army Second Lieutenants or Navy Ensigns. The event took place at the Plaza de la Revolution in Managua, the graduation of the 18th Class (referred as the Promotion of Ladies and Gentlemen Cadets) from the Center of Superior Military Studies "General Jose Dolores Estrada Vado" (in Spanish, Centro Superior de Estudios Militares - CSEM,) was the U.S. Army Military Academy at West Point equivalent for the Nicaraguan Army (EN). Nicaraguan President Daniel ((Ortega)) Saavedra, and General (GEN) Julio Cesar ((Aviles)) Castillo, Chief, Head of Defense (CHOD) presided over the ceremony. Major General (MG) Oscar Salvador ((BALLADARES)) Castillo, EN Chief of Staff, and Brigadier General Adolfo Jose ((ZEPEDA)) Martinez, Inspector General (IG) of the EN were also present, accompanied by several high-level government officials. 3. (U//FOUO) In his brief remarks, Second Lieutenant (EN Communication Corps) John Alex ((Martinez)), the distinguished graduate (first dossier), noted that "the 50 new soldiers, willing to serve with discipline, are the people of this Nation themselves in uniform, fulfilling missions and tasking for the benefit of the Nation." This graduation, said Martinez, is dedicated to Nicaraguan national hero 'Comandante German Pomeran Ordonez," an example of patriotism, loyalty, valor, charisma and humility.
