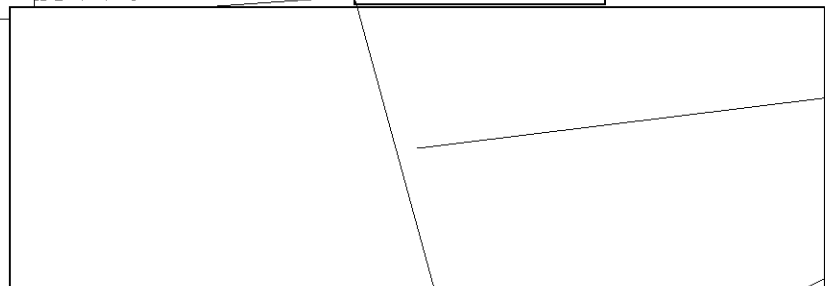

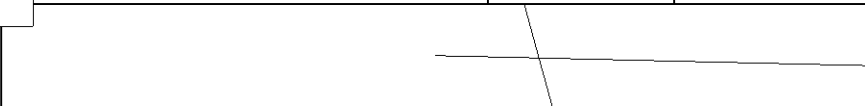



Academy at West Point equivalent), Nicaraguan Army (EN), took place. Nicaraguan President Daniel ((Ortega)) Saavedra and General Julio Cesar ((AVILES)) Castillo, Chief, Head of Defense (CHOD), presided over the ceremony, accompanied by several high-level Government of Nicaragua (GoN) officials. As is the usual norm, Ortega castigated U.S. policies, however, this time softening his rhetoric.

2. ~~(U//FOUO)~~ On 10 December 2013, fifty (50) Nicaraguan cadets were commissioned as new Nicaraguan Army Second Lieutenants or Navy Ensigns. The event took place at the Plaza de la Revolution in Managua, the graduation of the 18th Class (referred as the Promotion of Ladies and Gentlemen Cadets) from the Center of Superior Military Studies "General Jose Dolores Estrada Vado" (in Spanish, Centro Superior de Estudios Militares - CSEM,) was the U.S. Army Military Academy at West Point equivalent for the Nicaraguan Army (EN). Nicaraguan President Daniel ((Ortega)) Saavedra, and General (GEN) Julio Cesar ((Aviles)) Castillo, Chief, Head of Defense (CHOD) presided over the ceremony. Major General (MG) Oscar Salvador ((BALLADARES)) Castillo, EN Chief of Staff, and Brigadier General Adolfo Jose ((ZEPEDA)) Martinez, Inspector General (IG) of the EN were also present, accompanied by several high-level government officials.

3. ~~(U//FOUO)~~ In his brief remarks, Second Lieutenant (EN Communication Corps) John Alex ((Martinez)), the distinguished graduate (first dossier), noted that "the 50 new soldiers, willing to serve with discipline, are the people of this Nation themselves in uniform, fulfilling missions and tasking for the benefit of the Nation." This graduation, said Martinez, is dedicated to Nicaraguan national hero 'Comandante German Pomeran Ordonez,' an example of patriotism, loyalty, valor, charisma and humility.

~~(U//FOUO)~~ President Ortega's speech was ~~(U//FOUO)~~  ambulating in nature and touched on a broad variety of tangentially-related topics. Ortega used the recent death of Nelson ((Mandela)) to criticize U.S. foreign policy, comparing Mandela to Martin Luther ((King)), who he stated "was killed because the U.S. is a racist country." He stated that in spite of U.S. racism, President Barack ((Obama)) had been elected, and that now the U.S. President was seen shaking hands with the Cuban President at a recent event in South Africa. Ortega then stated that he hoped the U.S. would end its cruel embargo of the suffering Cuban people, an embargo which had been in place since the U.S. had been defeated during the Bay of Pigs invasion. Ortega then stated that much like the sound defeat of Imperialist forces in Cuba, the recent election results in Venezuela showed just how strong the people were. He then congratulated the "Pueblo Hermano" (Brother Society or People) of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, with a pro-Chavez slogan.

5. ~~(U//FOUO)~~ The Regular Cadet Course (in Spanish, Curso Regular de Cadetes - CRC) is comprised of four (4) years of military training at the EN Center of Superior Military Studies "General Jose Dolores Estrada Vado." Upon graduation, the cadets will receive a bachelor's degree (in Spanish, Licenciado) in Military Sciences, and the rank of Lieutenant. Cadets reportedly have the option of pursuing further

graduate studies in Nicaragua or abroad. Incentives of housing, pension contributions to the Institute of Social Military Services (in Spanish, Instituto de Prevision Social Militar - IPSM), and medical care for members and family members and other benefits are available. Admitted personnel receive full scholarships during the duration of the course, including room and board, as well as a monthly monetary stipend.
