Research conducted by my office identified a hostile enemy fire incident on July 5, 1966, that resulted in the loss of a UH-1D Iroquois helicopter (tail number 65-09793), and the death of three of its crewmembers after the crash from enemy small arms fire. This incident appears to correspond with the incident that (b)(6) described to his widow after their marriage.

As you will note from the incident summary obtained from the Vietnam Helicopter Pilots Association (VHPA), original sources included documents from the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) Helicopter Loss database.

In a manner consistent with all laws and regulations, I would appreciate it if the DIA would provide my office with all FOIA-releasable information related to this incident, which may possibly support a favorable Purple Heart award determination by the Army's Awards and Decorations Branch.
