(C/NOFORN) THE CAPTURE OF THE BULGARIAN TRAWLER "OFELIA" ON 1 OCT 77 WAS MORE DIFFICULT, A TOTAL OF 23 FIVE INCH ROUNDS WERE EXPENDED BY THE PY. RANGE OF THE 23 ROUNDS, VARIED BETWEEN 1500 AND 2000 YARDS, 19 WERE FIRED AHEAD OF THE SHIP AND WERE GRADUALLY WALKED BACK TO "OFELIA" "OFELIA" WAS THEN HIT BY FOUR INERT ROUNDS, TWICE BEFORE THE FIRST ROUND HIT. ROUNDS WERE FIRED SO CLOSE TO THE BOW OF "OFELIA" THAT WATER SPLASHED ONTO HER BRIDGE WINDOWS. CONSTANT WARNING SIGNALS BY RADIO AND LIGHT WERE MADE FOR ABOUT TWO HOURS DURING THE ACTION. "OFFILM" MAINTAINED AN EASTERLY COURSE AT 15KTS THE ENTIRE TIME. THE FIRST ROUND THAT IMPACTED TOOK OUT A PIECE OF THE SILHOUETTE OF THE STEM OF THE SHIP. A CEASE FIRE WAS ORDERED AND THEN COMMENCE FIRE WAS REDIRECTED AFTER THE RECEIPT OF AN ORDER FROM ADM MASSERA TO SINK THE SHIP AND RESCUE SUR-VIVORS. THIS OCCURRED AT ABOUT 0500 HOURS. THE NEXT ROUND HIT JUST BELOW THE BRIDGE CAUSING INJURY TO ONE CREWMAN SLEEPING IN A STATEROOM; THE LAST TWO ROUNDS ENTERED AMIDSHIPS JUST ABOVE THE WATERLINE, AND SHORTLY THEREAFTER "OFELIA" SENT HER FIRST SIGNAL BY FLASHING LIGHT AND INFORMED "PY" THAT SHE HAD A FIRE ABOARD. THESE ROUNDS HAD APPARENTLY ENTERED MACHINERY SPACES. "OFELIA" EFFECTED ENGINE REPAIRS AND AT THE SAME TIME TRANSFERRED THE WOUNDED CREWMAN ALONG WITH THEIR SHIP'S DOCTOR Sec. 3.3 TO "PY" VIA BOAT. WITHIN TWO HOURS THE PRIZE CREW WAS ABOARD "OFELIA". THE SHIP WAS ABLE TO MAKE HER MAXIMUM SPEED OF 15KTS

AND PROCEEDED TOWARD PUERTO MADRYN.

SDURCE STATED THAT THE "OFELIA" WAS ENCOUNTERED AT ABOUT 190 MILES FROM THE ARGENTINE COAST. WHEN APPREHENDED AFTER CONSTANT PURSUIT ALONGSIDE, SHE WAS DUTSIDE ARGENTINE WATERS BY A VERY ROUGH ESTIMATE OF 40-60 MILES. THE DFFICER OF THE PRIZE CREW SENT TO BOARD "OFELIA" TOLD SOURCE THAT CAPTAIN OF "OFELIA" SAID THAT HIS BRIDGE WAS NOT MANNED DURING THE ACTION, AND THAT HE EARLIER THOUGHT THAT HE WAS IN THE PRESENCE OF UNITS CON-DUCTING GUNNERY EXERCISES, SOURCE ADDITIONALLY LEARNED THAT THE RUSSIAN SHIPS WERE DANISH BUILT AND THE BULGARIAN SHIPS WERE POLISH BUILT.

COMMENT: (C/NOFORN) IT WAS QUITE A BRAZEN ACT FOR MASSERA TO ISSUE SUCH A HARSH COMMAND TO SINK THE SHIP. SOURCE REVEALED THAT THE DESTROYER DIVISION COMMANDER WAS

APPALLED WHEN HE RECEIVED THE ORDER.
